Failure Mode and Effects Analysis Workshop



Aims

The aims of the workshop are to help staff to:

- know the purpose of failure mode and effects analysis (FMEA) and how to use FMEAs to improve patient safety
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- carry out an FMEA properly.

Learning objectives

The workshop helps staff to understand the importance of being proactive about improving patient safety. Participants learn:

- what's involved in an FMEA and how it differs from analysis of an incident
- benefits of doing FMEA to patients, staff and the hospital
- how to carry out an FMEA in detail following stages represented by the acronym P-R-E-V-E-N-T
- practical tools and techniques to do each stage in an FMEA
- how to involve a team to work on an FMEA
- how to report on an FMEA.

Format

The workshop includes short presentations on stages in an FMEA. About half the workshop time is for small groups to complete an FMEA.

Materials

Each participant receives a copy of a 106–page book, *Using Failure Mode and Effects Analysis to Improve Patient Safety*, that includes principles, step-by-step guidance and examples, and a *Failure Mode and Effects Analysis Workbook* with practical assignments to do in the workshop. Certificates of participation in the workshop are provided.

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
